

DIAA HOMECOMING UPDATE

DIA will host the annual Homecoming for DIAA members on Thursday, 7 November. Association members will have the opportunity to meet with the Director, senior staff, as well as the Former Directors. The full homecoming agenda is being developed. We anticipate that briefings will be provided on current world hot spots, and time will be allowed to question functional and area subject matter analysts on topics within their expertise. In addition to the latest information on DIA's current focus and priorities, we will gain a sense of the challenges DIA is facing and a preview of the Agency's "way ahead".

Homecoming events will take place in the DIA Headquarters Building starting at 0715. A continental breakfast will be available prior to the start of the morning's briefings. LTG Flynn, will provide the keynote address, and will also be available for the DIAA Homecoming photo, along with the Deputy Director, Mr David Shedd.

The Torchbearer's Award Ceremony is scheduled for the same day as Homecoming. All DIAA members are invited to attend the ceremony and the reception following.

Torch Bearer's Award

The Director, Defense Intelligence Agency seeks to honor former Agency employees who distinguished themselves during their careers with extraordinary achievements in leadership and who demonstrated an exceptional level of commitment that had significant impacts upon DIA and the Intelligence Community.

The DIA Torch Bearers Award was created in 2010 to recognize outstanding achievements and long-term contributions to defense intelligence, and whose performance embodied the Agency's core values and principles. Any person who served in DIA as a civilian or a military professional, or who has a combination of both civilian and military service, is eligible for consideration.

To this end two current full-time DIA employees are appointed as members of the DIAA Board of Directors (BOD). SECURITY NOTE

Attendance at DIA's classified events (such as the Annual Homecoming) depends on retiree's having an up-to-date SF 86-Security Questionnaire on file with DIA. The SF-86 must be current within the past 10 years and its data must meet DIA's satisfaction in order to gain entry to events that involve Secret level information. If you do not want to attend such events, you do not have to do anything. If your investigation is out-of-date and you want to attend, you will have to fill-out a Questionnaire for National Security Positions (SF-86) and give it to DIA Personnel Security. CDR (USN, Ret) William S. Kosar, Jr.

CDR William Kosar passed away on Tuesday, July 2, 2013, at his residence in Vienna, VA. He was born in Peckville, PA on March 6, 1930. After graduation with an electrical engineering degree from the University of Southern California 1951 he entered the U.S. Navy Officer Candidate School in Rhode Island in 1952. In 1970 he transferred to Washington, DC to the Defense Intelligence Agency in the office responsible for DoD reporting and analysis on foreign aircraft and missiles, notably from the USSR and PRC.

Kosar is survived by his beloved wife Lydia (nee Pokrovsky) Kosar of Vienna, VA; sons William V. Kosar of Bradenton, FL, Nicholas A. Kosar of Oakton, VA, and George T. Kosar of Medford, MA; sister-in-law Larisa (nee Pokrovsky) Looby of Great Falls, VA and brother-in-law George Pokrovsky of Yokohama, Japan; as well as five granddaughters and one grandson. Mr. James Williamson

Mr. James "Will" Williamson died on July 5, 2013. He began his civilian career at DIA in June 2006, and was assigned as a Logistics Management Specialist in the Office of Logistics and Global Readiness, Directorate for Mission Services.

Mr. Williamson retired from the United States Air Force in 2001 after serving 23 years of active duty. He served in many critical roles during his tenure to include his last assignment at Langley Air Force Base, VA where he was responsible for ensuring worldwide preparation of Air Force expeditionary operations. From 2001 to 2006, Mr. Williamson served as a senior analyst for SYNERGY Inc. and Camber Corporation where he provided analysis and oversight of the Joint Transformation Integration system.
