### **MENTORING**

As reported in last months Newsletter a new mentoring program with the Council of Employees is scheduled to kick-off in mid-March. The Council of Employees is advertising the program to all DIA employees (DC area, CONUS and overseas) and will ask them for background info that will be provided to the mentor. In addition, they will be asked to identify what kind of mentoring they want. Examples include: assistance in fine-tuning a resume for a new job; assistance in developing tools to influence change; guidance in tackling a project that takes the employee out of his/her comfort zone; assistance in identifying positions that will make them more competitive; assistance in interview preparation; assistance with identifying training.

Once the mentor and mentee are matched, they will work out the specific details. The agreement will be for 3-hours of mentoring. Depending upon the topic, this could occur in one session or over a couple of months. The time, location and method of meeting, i.e, phone, e-mail or in person, will be agreed upon by both parties. 

**Carroll Duane Swenson** 85, of Richmond, passed away peacefully on 22 June 2014. From 1978 until he retired in 1993, he served in various high-level positions within DIA at the Pentagon, where he was responsible for studies, plans, and Congressional responses regarding Human Intelligence activities for DIA and CIA. Carroll is survived by his sons, Eric and Carroll Swenson, and his brother, Gerald Werth.



Michael Leon Wardinski, COL, USA (Ret.) of Alexandria passed away on 24 October 2014 at the age of 86. He proudly served his country in the United States Army, retiring as a Colonel after 33 years and going "green to gold." He served abroad in Japan and Germany, fought in wars in Korea and Vietnam, and was active in intelligence during the Cold Warwith the Pentagon and Defense Intelligence Agency. Interment with Full Military Honors will be held at a later date at Arlington National Cemetery.
