#### **MENTORING OPPORTUNITIES**

The Alumni Association continues to be active in mentoring current DIA employees in a variety of formal as well as informal settings. For example, earlier this year DIAA participated in a "Coffee and Conversations" program that focused on honing job interview skills. "Coffee and Conversations" is a monthly series sponsored by the Directorate for Mission Services dealing with topics of interest to the DIA workforce and is managed by Ms. Mary Quinn. This session was designed to assist hiring officials in developing better questions and to help interview candidates anticipate, prepare for, and provide effective answers to questions they are likely to be asked during a job interview. It played to a packed house and resulted in a lot of questions and interaction between the presenters, including DIAA volunteers, and the audience. Ms. Quinn is planning several future events and welcomes DIAA participation.

The DIA Council of Employees (COE) continues to champion the mentoring program for employees. They gave a lot of thought to how the program would be most effective and could draw upon the experiences of DIA alumni. The program has been approved by all the COE reps as well as several DIA seniors. This week the program providing individual mentoring opportunities was announced to all DIA personnel. Mentors will have a commitment of three-hours per person. The first mentoring matches will start this month.

### 21 APRIL DIFORUM

In the social time before the April DIForum lunch, DIAA members networked with friends and colleagues, to include former Director LTG (ret) Ed Soyster, and several members from DACOR. The guest speaker, Mr. Ralph E. Winnie, spoke on "Doing Business with China." As the Director of the Eurasian Business Coalition's China program, and the North American Business Development Representative for Gungxi Province Eurasian Business Coalition, he is responsible for advising domestic and foreign clients regarding international tax minimization strategies and joint ventures in China. He stressed that many U.S. business consultants have failed in China because they do not understand the value of networking, speak the language, or develop personal trust when conducting business.

To address these issues from the Chinese government's perspective President Xi Jinping has focused on strengthening the rule of law with a heavy emphasis on anti-corruption legislation and expounding the concept of "private property." The Chinese are also concerned about their image of exploiting third-world countries by obtaining needed natural resources without providing adequate compensation. Interestingly a Chinese affinity for minorities in the U.S. is demonstrated by their shipping unfinished products to Native American tribes for completion and then forwarding to distributors in the U.S. such as Wal-Mart and Target.

Concerned about the stability of the dollar has led the Chinese to consider alternative currencies as their reserve currency; the possibility of a real estate bubble burst is another major concern. Finally, Mr. Winnie made it clear the Chinese are expanding other business partner relationships world-wide to reduce the impact of any down turn in the U.S. economy. China's robust trade with Brazil and South Korea demonstrates this strategy.

After answering questions on Beijing's long-term economic objectives Ralph conducted sidebars with some of the attendees who have contacts working in China. Some sought Mr. Winnie's advice on how to exploit business opportunities in China.

# DIAA SUPPORTS JOINT MILITARY ATTACHÉ SCHOOL GRADUATION CEREMONY

On 10 April, the Joint Military Attaché School (JMAS) graduated its largest class ever. JMAS class 1501 included 68 graduates of the Attache Training Program (ATP) and 34 graduates of the Administrative Support Training Program (ASTP). Keynote speaker for this event was DIAA Board member Bill Huntington. In attendance for the graduation was Mrs. Stewart, the Director's wife, and DIA seniors from across the Agency.

In his address to the graduates, Bill stressed the importance of attaché reporting in keeping Defense policymakers and military commanders informed about important events unfolding around the world and their responsibility to represent the highest ideals of the American military in the foreign capitals where they were going to serve. He emphasized that attaches and their spouses must work together as a team in order to be successful in their mission. Mr. Huntington also noted the crucial role that Operations Support Coordinators (OPSCOs) and Operations Non-Commissioned Officers (OPSNCOs) play in the Defense Attache System

Bill presented the graduation certificates and represented DIAA in recognizing the Silver Pen Award recipient for the best country study paper and the distinguished graduates of the ASTP class. Winner of the Silver Pen Award was Navy LT Brown. The distinguished graduates for this class were CMSgt Karen Grider, USAF and SSG Christian Papp, USA. CMSgt Grider has been assigned as the OPSCO for Abuja, Nigeria, and SSG Papp has been assigned as the OPSNCO for Pretoria, South Africa. Papp and Grider will have their names added to the DIAA sponsored DG Plaque in the JMAS spaces. All of the awardees received the DIAA challenge coin. JMAS is highly appreciative of DIAA's continuing support of its training programs and DIAA is especially proud to be a part of this important enterprise.
